It is a "boundary garden" that gently separates the wild from people.

And the generosity of turning a blind eye to some things.

As deer food damage becomes more serious nationwide, this garden proposes a way of "boundary" that gently separates people and nature.

With the help of nature such as repellent plants, scent, sound, and light, we aimed to create a relaxing space where people can feel healed with all five senses, while informing deer that this is not a feeding ground. Not exclusion, but a subtle sense of distance. Deer are allowed to visit, but measures are taken so they cannot eat.

You can also feel the fun of walking around by visiting different spaces such as the forest atmosphere, fragrant lawn, and nursery area.
